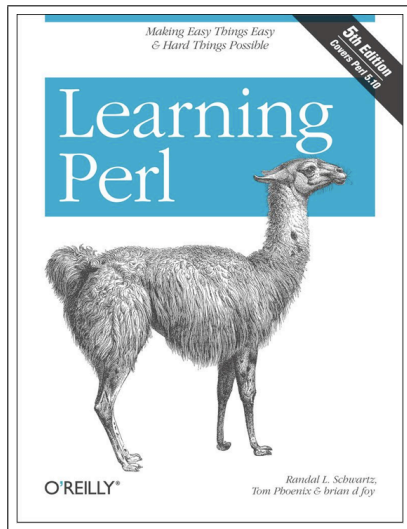

# What is Perl good for?

- ▶ Practical Extraction and Reporting Language
- ▶ Quick and Dirty
- ▶ Very good for file and string processing
- ▶ Much (but not all) of this lecture based on the “Llama Book”



# Why is Perl Popular?

- ▶ Seems a natural outgrowth of UNIX utilities like awk
- ▶ Combines benefits of interpreted and compiled code (How?)
- ▶ Lots of add-on packages available, via CPAN

# In many ways, Perl is like other languages

```
#!/usr/bin/perl  
print "Hello, world!\n"; # a short Perl example
```

- ▶ Usual arithmetic operations, although almost everything is floating point; there's no integer data type
- ▶ Much of the syntax is borrowed from C
